Human Environment + Built Environment



Integrating built environment, business environment and human environment for developing a sustainable district where smart mobility, smart economy and smart living would be realized.

Framework: Multi-disciplinary Approach in Developing Sustainable Built Environment @ CBD2



In this Kowloon East Project, our framework is designed to promote the following themes: connectivity, branding, diversity (youth + expatriates + locales), innovation and sustainability by integrating Human, Built and Business Environments.

Premium Tourist, Residential and Commercial Business Zone (Human Environment + Business Environment)

Ideas to develop this area:

- Premium Food and Beverage Tasting Event, Wedding Banquets, and Business Banquets by Hong Kong Trade Development Council who organize many successful international trade exhibitions. A HK brand of lifestyle.
- Green deck are constructed to connect the buildings in the both sides of Kowloon Bay, which not only increases the walkability for pedestrians, but also creates a great waterfront landscape.
- Modern commercial shops
- Smart digital techniques.





Low-carbon Green Zone (Built Environment)

Ideas to develop this area:

- Social enterprise and mid-price hotels help promoting green environment for green living.
- A centralized parking-lot: the residents and workers will transfer to local transportation system or walk.
- Highly concentration of green buildings so that this zone is like a green building exhibition district. Currently, the Zero Carbon World can act as the core for a HK brand of Green Campaign and extend to other districts.





Modern Residential & Commercial Zone

(Human Environment + Business Environment)

Ideas to develop this area:

- Street fairs and community activities.
- Mostly where the new public housing developed, activities to enhance sense of belonging in the neighborhood would encourage green behavior for supporting Low Carbon Green Zone.
- Neighborhood job fair to encourage employment within the involved transit nodes will provide labor pool to the adjacent wholesale and commercial zones.

Multipurpose Sports Center (Human Environment)

Ideas to develop this area:

- workmanship, knowledge and health are the key elements for nurturing sustainable individual in the society.
- Place Making: sport and well-being driven community activities: outdoor yoga free community classes or outdoor martial art classes...

Industrial Heritage Rehabilitation Zone

(E-Youth: Human Environment + Business Environment)

Ideas to develop this area:

- Industrial Spiritual Culture: organizing industrial art installation or competition in the area through event management.
- Youthful Culture: rehabilitating historical industrial buildings such as transforming the below <u>Kowloon Flour Factory into a youthful Back Packing Guest House</u> and youthful oriented studio, bookshops and coffee shops....band rooms.
- Food Culture: international wholesale food hub supported by international tourists from cruise terminals and tourists from Mainland China (inter-city-train). Jump starting local economic growth and building international friendship.
- World Culture Exchange (East Meets West): a youthful lifestyle hub for local, Mainland China and International exchange through public gathering, youth-oriented events and social gathering such as a younger LKF.



The Current Landscape of The Industrial Area

E-Youth: Catalyst to CBD2 (APM 101 Industrial Heritage Rehabilitation Zone) A community for nurturing youthful culture (Human Environment)

Purpose: dedicate a domain to HK Youth and let them have a sense of belonging and harness their youthful energy as the catalyst to transform Kowloon East into the jewel crown of Asia's World City.



United FOOD Nation

(Human Environment + Business Environment)

- Inter-nation-festival: international street food parade(Brazilian carnival, Cinco de Mayo, Irish Fest. Le French May & Rugby 7
- Reflects the essence of the place: culture & people
- Increases foot traffic and retail business
- Expands international friendship





TOD concept is used to connect the 5 function zones, major transit nodes are Kwun Tong, Kowloon Bay and Kai Tak (Built Environment)



Definition:

Transit-Oriented-Development (TOD) is a sustainable urban strategy to encourage transit, walking and cycling as a travel mode by clustering mixed-use, high density development around transit stations (Calthorpe 1993)

Objective: Green transportation, city exploration & green development and linking to West Kowloon Cultural District.

Master Plan: Work in Progress (20-year plan and onwards)



Evaluation: as urban development is a long-term financial project, extensive amount of money and effort would be invested and of course, result should be evaluated for the purpose of further improvement.

Evaluation tool: using the custom-made **Wheel of CBD2 & Serious Game Learning Tool** to help collect data and fine tune the performance of the smart district by altering users/residents behavior.

Future Development: The Wheel of CBD2 & Serious Game Learning Tool An evaluation composite indicators for policy analysis and communication Our current research project developed with Politecnico Di Torino (PoliTO) Italy.



Now let me conclude this presentation, we believe that a smart city addresses not only built environment, but also human environment and business environment exist in every level of urban development. It allows room for creativity, flexibility and mobility. It should welcome diversity and embraces transparency rather than division...definitely not a gated community.
